Annual General Meeting 2017



The NGO Forum on Cambodia (NGOF) and its network organizations and members hold the Annual General Meeting 2017 at Somatevy Hotel in Siem Reap Province on 24 October 2017, participated by 160 participants from national and provincial levels. The annual general meeting focuses on update on Cambodia Sustainable Development (CSDG), update on the NGO Forum's key achievements for the last one year and the results of 2012-2017 NGOF evaluation. Furthermore, discuss on next 6 year strategic plan (2018-2023) and 3 year action plan (2018-2020) of each NGO networks. The meeting is presided over by Mr. Norng Sivouthan, member of management committee and Executive Director of HESK EPER, H.E Poch Sovandy, Advisor to Ministry of Planning and Mr. Tek Vannara, Executive Director of NGOs Forum.

Mr. Norng Sivouthan, open remarked that the annual general meeting is important that we must attend and share information together and more importantly we are here, we can reflect to the works done in the past years, we will reflect together the achievement of NGO Forum and we will discuss together the main topics that can reflect to NGO Forum for the next six years,

we will study together on what experience and the lessons learnt we have received, related to what we have learned to what we can improved together, particularly the meeting has a present of H.E Poch Vanndy, the adviser to MoP, he will present you and discuss on the government policies, related the Goal of Sustainability that set by UN and the goal of CSDGs.

2nd Quarterly Meeting on Member of the Network for Agricultural Development, Food Security and Safety in Cambodia (NDF-C)



On October 13, 2017, Second Quarterly Meeting on Member of the Network for Agricultural Development, Food Security and Safety in Cambodia (NDF-C) which was held in The Green Palace Hotel, Preah Vihear Province. The main agenda of the meeting:

1. Review the 7 national Farmer Forum, 2. Discuss the preparation of the 7th Farmer Forum and 3. The Action Plan of the Network for Agricultural Development, Food Security and Food Security in Cambodia for October-December 2017.

The meeting opened the discussion on reviewing report and some recommendations were raised in the meeting. Mr. Savon Samol , would suggested that the Meeting of the Network for Agricultural Development, Food Security and Food Security in Cambodia, would gathers inputs for a meeting with the Prime Minister , which summarizes key achievements of the Royal Government to include in the recommendations.

Mr. Chheang Sok Mao, he provided suggestions and advice with following points:

- 1) The ADI should read the Farmer Forum report from 2010 to 2016, which includes farmers' concerns in policies.
- 2) Government projects in 2015-2016, which have worked to promote the agricultural product market (Boosting Food Production Project, TSSD).
- 3) Farmers 'perceptions of sufficient government responses to farmers' needs.

Mekong Mainstream Dam and Its tributaries: Progress, Challenges and Resolution Mechanism in the Greater Mekong Forum on Water, Food and Energy



October 25-27, 2017 Mr Tek Vannara, Executive Director of the NGO FO-RUM participated as guest speaker on the topic Mekong Mainstream Dam and Its tributaries: Progress, Challenges and Resolution Mechanism in the Greater Mekong Forum on Water, Food and Energy which organized by WEL, IWMI, Greater Mekong, MAI and CGIAR at Inya Lake Hotel, Yangon, Myanmar. In discussion panel, Mr Vannara raised and asked all stakeholder consideration on people participation, the quality of environmental impact assessment report, cost and benefit analysis of large scale dam development project, good resettlement and fair compensation, conflict resolution mechanism and implementation of environment management plan.



Forum on "Youth Participation in Budgetary Process at National and Sub-National Level"



On Friday 13th October 2017, The National Budget Project (NBP) of the NGO Forum on Cambodia (NGOF) with their Budget Working Group (BWG) members including Advocay and Policy Institue (API), Affiliated Network for Soical Accountability (ANSA), Cambodians for Resource Revenue Transparency (CRRT), Gender and Developmnet for Cambodia (GADC), Star Kampuchea (SK), Transparency International Cambodia (TIC), and Save the Children, co-organized the Forum on "Youth Participation in Budgetary Process at National and Sub-National Level" under the finacial support of EU, Sida, Oxfam, and DCA at Himawari Hotel, Phnom Penh Capital, Cambodia. There were 227 participants (105 women) including monks, youth from provinces, universities, national and international NGOs in Cambodia participated in this event. The objectives of this fourm are increase awarenesss on fiscal budget transparency including budget information process and budget transparency at National and Sub-national level; and better understanding on National Assembly's role on the operation of draft budget law process (commission 2) and learning/sharing on budget understanding.

The forum was opened and welcomed by Ms. Lim Solin, Country Director of Oxfam. First of all, she thanked to all participants who attending this forum and mentioned the importance of citizen involvement in national budget development and implementation process. Cambodia is ranked as

the 8th country among 100 countries that still has limited participation of citizen in the national budgeting. This is due to the lack of technical capacity of them to involve in this process. However, currently, it was observed the improvment of this participation as many stakeholders including NGOs/CSOs and citizen have involved more with government on this issue. Then, she addressed two key remarks.

- She would like to thank to the Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) particularly Ministry of Economic and Finance (MEF) who open more space for CSOs and youth engagment in the national budget development both at national and sub-national level. RGC plays an important role as a partner with the NGOs to do awareness raising on national budget information. The website of MEF is recognized by the public. In 2015, MEF and National Assembly (NA) shared the National Budget Law and encouraged for more involvement from releveant stakeholders. All of these could reflect as a good participation and is being a part of making transparency on National Budget Development in Cambodia.

- 70% of Cambodia peple is under 30 year olds. This shows that we have more labor and potential people for the purpose of country development. Budget use on education and public health service is very important to know by citizen particularly the young people. As Cambodia is the democratic society, optimistic involvement from

Mr Tek Vannara, executive director of the NGO FORUM on Cambodia (NGOF) and his colleagues participated in launch of Cambodia Component of the UNDP-SIDA Regional Program on strengthening the governance of the Climate Change Finance to Enhance Gender Equality 2017-2022 which organized by UNDP and MoE held on 27 September 2017 at Le Royal Hotel, Phnom Penh, Cambodia. Especially, the NGOF and UNDP has been discussed on future cooperation for implementing climate change programme budget.





Knowledge Exchange Forum on the Implementation of SDGs



In 2017, Exchange knowledge on the implementation of SDGs conducted in Makati Diamond Residences, Manila, Philliphine brought together over 200 participants for over countries in the region. The regional knowledge exchange is generously co-hosted by Government of Philippine, through National Economic and Development Authorities, and brought together senior government official and civil society organization from Asia and the Pacific who were involved in planning, financing, monitoring and implementing the 2030 Agenda, together with technical experts, civil society and development partners.

Theme of the 2017 regional Exchange was on the ensuring policy coherence across sectors and between national and sub-national government to accelerate progress toward sustainable development in 2030. It also looked at how countries are promoting coherence in terms of their financing of SDGs across both public and private sectors, as well as international domestic sources of financing.

The objective of this event intends to provide a platform for countries to share their experience and emerging good practice.

3 preventatives were opened welcome remarks: Ola Almgren, UN Resident Coordinator, Philliphines, Undersecretary Rosemarie G.Edillon National Economic and Development Authorities, Philliphine, Haoliang Xu, UN Assistant Secretary-General UNDP assistant Administrator, Director of regional Bureau for Asia and the Pacific. In addition, also there was overview of regional knowl-

edge exchange which presented by Micheila Prokop, Regional Advisor 2030 Agenda, Bankgkok, regional Hub, UNDP.

There were 8 sessions: first session focused on Taking stock/Overview of progress, while there were sub- session (Regional SDGs report/Overview of the progress, report back from HLPF 2017 and taking stock from Civil society). The second session on Integrating the 2030 Agenda into National strategies-Lesson learn and next steps. In this session, there were two presenter from Philliphine and Saomoa. The session II provided an overview of various dimemsion of policy coherence and building block of required for coherent implementation of the 2030 Agenda. It discussed the role of institutional coordination mechanism to support policy coherence and multi-stakeholder engagement. The session III. On Supporting Policy Coherence-2030 agenda/SDGs Coordination mechanism, there were 3 presenter from OECD with Indonesia, Pakistan and Philliphine, this also CSOs were invited to share their perspective. Session IV. Multi-Stakeholder Engagement, while the session discussed the important of multi-stakeholder engagement for accelerating progress towards the SDGs through focusing on some key partnerships. It featured examples and lessons learnt to strengthen the engagement between governments and civil society and other stakeholder in the implementation of the agenda 2030. Aside from this in session there were also the parallel session (A: Civil Society, B. Development Partner and C. UN Partnership).

Consultation Workshop on "Policy Development and Civil Society Organizations"



On September 08, 2017 at Interchurch Friend Center: CCC and NGO Forum co-organize Consultation Workshop on "Policy Development and Civil Society Organizations". There are approximately 100 participants who are from CSOs, associations, CBOs, formal and informal groups to join this consultation.

This consultation aims to provide update on the LANGO and Taxation Law, to confirm the common position and capacity of CSOs towards the compliance and implications of LANGO and Taxation Law, and identify ways forwards for CSOs to be responsive and complied with the laws.





Workshop on National and International Standards on Land and Housing Rights



On October 10-11, 2017, in collaboration with the Preah Sihanouk provincial authorities, the OHCHR Office co-organized with NGO Forum and ADHOC a workshop on the National and International Standards on Land and Housing. 61 participants, including police officers, military commanders, district officials, commune council members, and members of varies land and housing rights networks attended the two-day workshop. Preah Sihanouk Court of First Instance, OHCHR, NGO Forum and ADHOC were shared their expertise and experience with the participants.

In response to growing tourism in coastal areas, development projects are being implemented to meet infrastructural needs. This has led to internal migration, which has resulted in an increase in demographic pressure in urban areas, this is particularly the case in Preah Sihanouk Province.

These developments have lead to the relocation of individuals and communities, particularly those who have been living in informal settlements, or on state land with no documentation to demonstrate possession rights. Security of land tenure is essential for the enjoyment of human rights. Authorities have an obligation to address and minimize this impact on individual's lives. Evictions must be considered as a last resort. In order to resolve the negative impacts of development projects, workshops relating to land

and housing rights, have been designed by OHCHR, ADHOC and NGO Forum.

The policy also proposes implementing houses for renting, state donated land to families or communities, relocation, on site-upgrade development, family forest policy for housing, and ensured housing for workers/employees. The policy is a roadmap to ensure adequate and secure housing for all people.

According to a 2014 survey, the head of the family owns 93.8 % houses but those houses are adequate for living. There are also many individuals who have moved to the city for jobs but whom cannot find housing. In accordance to the secure tenure of housing, only land is registered, not houses or buildings under co-ownership. A draft policy on motivation and national programming for affordable housing development has hence been developed. It focuses on the state infrastructure, the creation of electricity and water systems in the housing areas constructed by the private sector.

Ms. Keat Bophal, Human Rights Officer, presented the International standards on rights to land and housing: The definition of rights to adequate housing. It is the right of every woman, man, youth and child to gain/sus-

Mr. Tek Vannara, Executive Director of the NGO FORUM on Cambodia, Ms Chet Chariya, executive director of Star Kampuchea, Mr Pan Sopheap, Executive Director of Farmer and Nature Net Association (FNN) participated Land Forum ILC Asia 2017 under them "People Centered Land Governance: Securing Commons Land Use Rights Towards Improve Livelihoods of Local Communities in Asia which organized by International Land Coalition (ILC) and its members at Damas Hotel, Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan on 12 September 2017. There are two main topics were discussed in the forum 1)Strengthening effective land governance in agriculture and pastures and 2)Promoting sustainable joint forest management by working with forestry user.

Mr Tek Vannara, executive director of the NGO FORUM on Cambodia participated in International Land Coalition Asia 2017 Regional Assembly held on 13-15 September 2017 at Issyk Kul Region, Kyrgyz Republic. There are 42 NGOs member of ILC who are come from Asia participated in the assembly for discussion on achievements, lesson learnt, reports, action plan, budget, challenges and solutions, especially decide on the membership, strategic plan, next year action plan and budget and the future cooperation among ILC member. During the assembly meeting, there are some lesson learnt have been shared such as Common Ground for Securing Land Right and Safeguarding the Earth and Indigenous People Documents. The NGO FORUM on Cambodia became a member of ILC since 2012.

Annual Meeting of the World Bank



On October 12, 2017, Mr Tek Vannara, Executive Director of the NGO FORUM on Cambodia participated and discussion on the topics 1)Model of CSO engagement with World Bank Country Programmes and 2)Diagnosing Governance Challenges in the Extractive Sector: The Resource Governance Index and Beyond. Discussions focused on the role of World Bank and International Finance Cooperation (IFC) for strengthening Social and Environmental Safeguards System to ensure resources are using in transparency and responses to the need of the people who living in the programmes target, especially open spaces for public participation consultation and decision among stakeholders in the whole process of project/programme development. These event organized in the annual meeting of the world bank group in Washington DC, USA.

On October 13, 2017 Mr. Tek Vannara, Executive Director of the NGO FORUM on Cambodia were participated and discussion on many topics such as 1)The Value of Accountability Mechanisms: By Whom and For What? 2)Forests, Climate and Land Rights: How Can Policy Lending Address the Major Challenges of Development 3)Support the Renewable Energy Development 4)

CSO and World Bank: Consultation and Country Partnership Frame Work and 5)Civil Society Policy Forum Sponsored CSO Feedbacks. The major discussions focused on how World Bank Group Improve itself on accountability and transparency by giving spaces and consultation with stakeholders in CPF. Beside of these meetings, Mr Tek Vannara were visited to the NGOF's partner offices such as Oxfam, International Budget Partnership, Bank Information Center, STIMSON Center and George Washington University, there are many topics around partnership have been discussions and agreed for the future cooperation.





Roundtable Discussion NGOs from China and Cambodia



On September 19,2017, Mr Tek Vannara, executive director of the NGO FORUM on Cambodia participated in the Roundtable Discussion NGOs from China and Cambodia on Promoting in depth Cooperation by People to People Exchange which organized by China Foundation for Peace and Development (CFPD) at CFPD office in Phnom Penh. Discussion focus on role, contributions and programmes of both CSOs which are operating in Cambodia, especially to discuss on the way of current and future cooperation to sustainable development and harmonization of both CSOs.





Visiting Achang Irrigation Development Project



On October 01, 2017, The NGO Forum on Cambodia through the Community Rights on Hydropower Dam Project to visit Achang Irrigation Development Project in Cambodia is located in Kampong Chhnang Province, which is 41km far away from Kampong Chhnang city, 120km far away from northwest of capital city Phnom Penh. No.5 highway passes the dam area which is 22.4km far away from the highway. The project's owner is the Ministry of Water Resources and Meteorology of Cambodia. Sinohydro Group Ltd. is the EPC contractor and the supervision unit is Guangzhou Wanan Construction supervision co,ltd. This project is financed by concessional loans from China government.

This project aims at irrigation and also takes account of ecological water supply. The whole project is made of two parts, one is Irrigation canal system that could service 10300 hectares irrigated area, 12 km along the left bank of the river. The other part is a diversion junction which is made of entrance gate, drainage brake, overflow dam, left and right bank connectors. The normal level of the dam is 28m, and the barrage diversion works to elevate the water to get intake water level to be brought into main canal. By main and branch canal construction the water could be transported to farmland. The project mainly contains: a sluice gate, an overflow dam, an inlet sluice, connection sector between left and right bank, main canal, branch canal, and 10regulators, 10 turnout gates, 7 culverts, 10 inverted siphon pipes on main canal, and 49 regulators,100 turn-out gates, 24 culverts, 20 inverted siphon pipes on branch canal. Total project durations is 35 months, we planned to hand over the final project certificate in October, 2018. Source: Sinohydro Group Ltd website.

Executive director of the NGO FORUM on Cambodia and his colleagues participated in Interministerial high level meeting to review and approve on the draft of Cambodia Sustainable Development Goals Framework which organized by Ministry of Planning (MoP) with support from UNFPA held on 29 September 2017 at Cambodiana Hotel, Phnom Penh. The draft of CSDG were consulted with stakeholders in 5

times which the last consultation held on 21 May 2017 before inter-ministerial meeting today. The MoP will screen and revise again before submit to top high level meeting for making final decision and ensure all indicators of CSDG are measurable, realistic and can implementable reflect to real situation of Cambodia Development.
